21. Old oared longboat, now a museum exhibit.

24. General view of Norfolk Island cemetery, Cemetery Bay which is an historic site.
25. Grave of Mary Christian, daughter of Fletcher Christian (mutineer). Known as Mary 'Lasso' Christian, born Pitcairn Island in 1793, died Norfolk Island in 1866. (Age on tombstone incorrect.)
26. Grave of Arthur Quintal, son of Mathew Quintal (mutineer). Born on Pitcairn Island c.1794/95. Died on Norfolk Island 1873.
27. Grave of Mathew Quintal, grandson of Mathew Quintal (mutineer). Born on Pitcairn Island 1814. Died Norfolk Island 1865 (batchelor).
28. Grave of George Hunn Nobbs, Chaplain of Pitcairn Island and Norfolk Island. Arrived Pitcairn Island 1828. Died Norfolk Island 1884.
29. Grave of Fletcher Christian Nobbs, son of George Hunn Nobbs and Sarah Christian 'Big Salah'. Married Susan Quintal in 1853.
30. No. 10 Quality Row. Foreman of Works quarters during the penal colony period. House allocated to Isaac Christian and his wife Miriam Young and their fifteen children.
31. No. 10 Quality Row. Dining Room. House is now a museum.
32. St. Barnabas Chapel, dedicated as a memorial in 1880 to John Coleridge Patteson, Bishop of Melanesia.
33. Fletcher Christian Road. Highlights Norfolk's close connection to Pitcairn Island.
34. Pitcairn Island settlers tour, depicting the early life of the Pitcairners on Norfolk.

35. C.C.R. Nobbs Store. Pitcairn Island settlers village tour.
36. Pitcairn wheelbarrow. Pitcairn Island settlers village tour.
37. Bounty Folk Museum depicting history of the Bounty, Pitcairn and Norfolk Islands.
38. Mutiny on the Bounty show. Stage setting.
39. Kingston Jetty from Point Ross Reserve, home of author Peter Clarke.
